Join us as we celebrate and explore all that Pentecost means for us, on Sunday, May 28, 2023 and beyond.

What does Pentecost mean to you?

"The Christian holiday of Pentecost is rooted in this historical event – an event sometimes called the "birthday of the church" because it marks the day that Jesus' disciples began to share the story of Jesus and invite others to share in their faith in Jesus as the Son of God.

But Pentecost is more than just remembering a historical event. On Pentecost, we invite the same Spirit that filled the disciples that day to transform our lives. Even more important than looking backward and remembering what God did two thousand years ago, we look forward and invite the Spirit to pull us into the future. The Holy Spirit has a way of turning things upside down. The story of Acts is all about how the lives of the disciples got turned upside down – and by extension, how the world turned upside down by this new, Spirit-filled faith.

On Pentecost we invite this disruptive presence of God into our own lives. The fruit of the Spirit, says Paul, is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These are what we seek to live into, how we seek to transform the world, and the evidence of the Spirit at work in our lives and in the world."

Pastor Meheret's Corner

Now on that same day [when Jesus had appeared to Mary Magdalene,] two of them [disciples] were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" They stood still, looking sad.

Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?" He asked them, "What things?" They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel.

Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him."

Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures." (Luke 24:13-27, NRSV)

This story of the Risen Jesus appearing to his disciples as they make their way from Jerusalem to Emmaus is a favorite of mine. And this year, especially, the experience of Cleopas and the other unnamed disciple seems even more appropriate as God's people live into the reality of the resurrection in this season of Easter 2023.

Given all that we have going on around us, as wars continue, as relationships are strained, as God's people drift further and further apart, I feel in my bones the sadness and disappointment that those first disciples felt on that first Easter day as they lament, "But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel." (Luke 24:21) It seems as though the voices swirling around us, voices that divide, voices that give words to our anguish and grief for a past that isn't coming back, and voices that remind us that the reality of 2023 isn't what we had thought it would be as we looked forward these past few years might be overshadowing the hope of the resurrection as we join those first disciples and wonder, "But we had hoped ...".

In so many ways, we are more like those first disciples than we might have previously thought. For even though Jesus had told those closest to him that he would in fact be handed over, tried, crucified, and raised in three days, and even though that is exactly what happened, it seems that those first disciples didn't fully comprehend what Jesus' words meant. As they heard Jesus' words, as they heard the voices from the prophets and the scriptures, voices that always told God's people about the counter-cultural way God's love made real in the world as the kingdom of heaven came near, they did so through filters of all of those other voices swirling around them.

And Jesus seems to know this as, instead of shaming them, Jesus continues teaching them, and, in the end, opens their hearts to the earth-shattering reality that our Easter greeting, "Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!" brings to life: all those other voices do not have the final say. Instead, God does as God's people are shown that there is nothing of this world that can stand in the way of God's faithfulness to loving God's people.

That's the hope that was revealed that day on that road to Emmaus, a hope that was delivered, once again as we are shown that Jesus will walk with us, even as we might be sad and lament, that Jesus continues to teach us through the words of the prophets and scriptures, and that Jesus continues to reveal God's kingdom of God among us.

And that's the hope we live in today as well as, together, we live into those words of promise, during this season of Easter and every day: "Christ is Risen, indeed! Alleluia!"





Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!


































