Down the Mountain:

“But Jesus came and touched them, saying, “Get up and do not be afraid.” And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.” –Matthew 17.7-8

The Transfiguration is more than a stand-alone story; it is part of the larger story of salvation. Moses and Elijah are witnesses; Peter, James and John stand near; and you and I are privileged guests, too.

Moses embodies the giving of the Law and Elijah represents the prophets. Just as Christians know Jesus, God’s Word made flesh; the people of Israel refer to God’s Word as the Law and the Prophets when speaking of the collected revelation to the chosen people. To be in the presence of Moses, Elijah, and Jesus is emblematic of all of God’s covenants, promises and wisdom. And it culminates with a voice from heaven that cuts through the cloud and makes clear: “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.”

As we make our way down Transfiguration Mountain and begin this journey to the cross, which is the road to resurrection, I want to assure you of this fact: Jesus has something to say to you and for us. How will you hear? What will it take to get yourself to a place where you can hear? How can we reconnect to our scattered communities of faith and listen together? We’ve lived in a well-placed pandemic fear for a long time, but, dear ones, spring and Easter are coming, and we are being called into a new season – and to a living hope in Christ!

United Methodist Pastor Steve Garnaas-Holmes writes:
Listen for the One amid the others,
the one who awakens something lovely in you.

If you don’t turn from this clanging world to listen
you won’t hear him.

Listen for the voice that calls you Beloved,
the voice that calls you to love.

A voice that leads you toward others,
not your own rising above and away.

Listen to the song of the immense flowering within you,
the risk and passion you can dance to.

You will hear it in stillness, not in frenzy,
in silence, not in noise.

You will hear it from those who are belittled,
not those who are honored by this besotted world.

The Beloved will not speak of success,
but death and resurrection.

Listen for one who speaks with hope and delight,
listen to him. Listen to him.

Why don't we use alleluias during Lent?

Based on the Hebrew word, hallelujah, meaning “Praise the Lord,” alleluia has been a word of great praise to God in the life of the church and was prominent in early Christian liturgies. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent in the Western church, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. The hymn "Alleluia, song of gladness" (Evangelical Lutheran Worship #318) contains a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.

Update: Food for Thought Baltimore County has been the umbrella organization which recruited, provided training and nutritional guidance, and provided some financial support to churches and organizations interested in addressing food insecurity found among students in Baltimore County schools. With their role diminishing, the organization is now disbanding but encouraging participating churches to continue their partnerships with area schools. To help in this effort they have distributed the last of their remaining funds in the form of gift cards for groceries for the families of Food for Thought students. As a result, once we have distributed the remaining supply of food we have purchased, we will be shifting to providing gift cards for our families at Middleborough School, as we did during the pandemic. When all these gift cards have been given out, we will evaluate during the 2023-24 school year whether to purchase gift cards from the funds in our account or to return to providing weekend backpacks of nutritious foods.
